**Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR)**  
**Admission Deadline: May 15, 2021**

**\*\*To be eligible to participate in the competitive admissions process for Spring 2022, an applicant must complete items 1-8, with completion of each item verified by a staff member's initials & date, by the above deadline.**

\_\_\_\_\_ **1. Complete the RCCC college admission process.**

Submit an online application or online reactivation form; submit final official high school transcript (with graduation date) or GED scores, and official college transcripts (if applicable). **Note: It can take approximately two weeks to receive and process transcripts.** For current high school seniors, please submit an official high school transcript with first semester senior grades noted. Upon graduation, submit an official final transcript noting date graduated.

\_\_\_\_\_ **2. Meet North Carolina Community College standards for placement into college level Math (Tier 1 & 2) and English (Tier 1 & 2) or have completed acceptable college level coursework in Math and English.**

\_\_\_\_\_ **3. Attend a required group Nursing Admission Advising Session as soon as possible. Attendance at a session will fulfill this requirement within twelve months of admission deadline stated above.**

You cannot proceed in the nursing admissions process until you have attended a session. Please do not delay in scheduling a session. Go to <https://www.rccc.edu/healtheducation/nursing-admission-advising-session/>. Sessions are offered on the North or South Campus.

\_\_\_\_\_ **5. Meet biology and chemistry competencies:**

- Completion and documentation of a high school or college biology course with a grade of "C" or higher
- Completion and documentation of a high school or college chemistry course with a grade of "C" or higher

\_\_\_\_\_ **6. Meet the Nurse Aide I requirements:**

- Completion and documentation of a NC state approved CNA 1 course or its equivalent
- Current listing on the NC Nurse Aide 1 Registry with no substantiated finding of resident abuse, resident neglect or misappropriation of resident property in a nursing facility. Admissions Office will verify.

\_\_\_\_\_ **7. Attend a required Nursing Program Information Session within twelve (12) months of admission**

Submit a Spring 2022 Admission Eligibility Form**—File reviews for Spring 2022 eligibility will occur only on applicants who have submitted this form. ***This form is required each admission point/year*** and you must meet with Robin Seropian (North Campus) or Pat Cannon (South Campus) to complete this form. ## After completion of Spring 2022 Program Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR)

### Program Admission Testing and Point System Evaluation

The RCCC Testing Center will Kaplan testing for qualified applicants tentatively administered in June/July 2021. Eligible applicants will be emailed information on scheduling the Kaplan Admission Test in late May. Eligible students will then submit acceptable **Kaplan** or **ATI TEAS** test scores from 2020 or 2021. ***Only students who meet the qualifying score(s) will continue on to the point system evaluation for ranking to determine contingent acceptance status or placement on an alternate list for Spring 2022 admissions.***

**Applicants will receive notice of contingent acceptance or alternate status** in August 2021. The Associate Degree Nursing program accepts a maximum of 45 qualified students to begin each fall and spring semester.

### Contingent Acceptance

Completion of the following is required **only** for those who are offered conditional (contingent) acceptance into the nursing program. In late August 2021, a **Nursing Health Packet Information Session** will provide information and forms for the following:

- **Current CPR/AED Certification:** BLS Healthcare Provider level, preferably taken at RCCC.
- **Background Report/Drug Screen:** Clinical facilities require criminal background checks and drug screening for students assigned to their facility for clinical education. In addition, the national and/or state registry and licensure boards ***may prohibit eligibility for registry or licensure based on a felony conviction.*** If a student is denied access to a clinical facility based on criminal background check and/or drug-screening results, the student will not receive a secondary placement in another facility. The student will **NOT** be able to meet competencies required for progression in the program.
- **Physical Examination/Current Immunization Documentation**
- **Orientation Day/Readiness for Nursing:** Additional details will be provided in August and is tentatively scheduled for early January 2022.
