Spring 2022 Licensed Practical Nursing to Associate Degree Nursing
Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR)
Admission Deadline: July 31, 2021

**** To be eligible to participate in the competitive admissions process for Spring 2022, an applicant must complete items 1-7 by the above deadline. Note: Meeting all minimum admission requirements does not guarantee acceptance into the program.**

- 1. Complete college admission process:** Submit an online application or online reactivation form; submit official high school transcript (with graduation date) or GED and college transcripts (if applicable).
Note: It can take approximately two weeks to receive and process transcripts.
- 2. Meet North Carolina Community College standards for placement into college level Math** (Tier 1 and 2) or have completed acceptable college level coursework in Math.
- 3. Schedule an individual appointment with your assigned health program advisor.** Contact Robin Seropian (North Campus) at robin.seropian@rccc.edu or Pat Cannon (South Campus) at pat.cannon@rccc.edu.
- 4. Have completed all required ADN general education courses with a “C” or better.**

- 5. Hold an unrestricted North Carolina or compact state license as an LPN. Licensure must be held by the first day of class.** Applicants may apply while waiting to test for the NCLEX-PN but will only be accepted in a contingent state until licensure is granted.
- 6. Attend a required LPN to ADN Program Information Session within twelve (12) months of admission deadline.**
Sessions will be held at the N.C. Research Campus at 399 Biotechnology Lane in Kannapolis, N.C. starting at 1pm and ending by 2:30pm. You will be directed to a location upon arrival. Registration is not required but please attend a session as soon as possible.
Note: Due to COVID-19, on campus sessions may not be possible. Please contact your advisor (#3 above) to send the appropriate email/link.

- 7. Complete and submit a Spring 2022 Admission Eligibility Form**—File reviews for Spring 2022 eligibility will be conducted only on applicants who submit this form. This form is required each year and you must meet with Robin Seropian (North Campus) or Pat Cannon (South Campus) to complete this form. Contact information is in item #3.

After completion of Spring 2022 LPN to ADN Minimum Admission Requirements (MAR):

Program Admission Testing and Point System Evaluation

- ❖ Eligible applicants will be emailed (via RCCC student email) directions for scheduling the Entry Exam and submission of the point system scorecard.
- ❖ Only students who meet the qualifying test score of 80% or higher on the RCCC LPN to ADN Entry Exam will continue on to the point system for ranking to be offered contingent acceptance or to be placed on the alternate list for Spring 2022 admissions. Testing is tentatively scheduled for mid-September 2021.
- ❖ Applicants will be notified of acceptance or alternate status in October 2021. The LPN to ADN program accepts a maximum of 20 qualified students to begin each spring semester.

Contingent Acceptance

Completion of the following is required **only** for those who have been offered contingent acceptance into the LPN to ADN program. Information will be provided by the Nursing Department at a Health Packet Orientation Session the last week of October.

- ❖ **Orientation/Readiness for Nursing course.** Additional details will be provided and will be tentatively scheduled for Fall 2021.
- ❖ **Background Report/Drug Screen:** Clinical facilities require criminal background checks and drug screening for students assigned to their facility for clinical education. In addition, national and/or state registry and licensure boards may prohibit eligibility for registry or licensure based on criminal background records. If a student is denied access to participate in clinical practice by the facility based on their criminal background check and/or drug screen results, the student will NOT receive a secondary placement in another facility. The student will not be able to meet competencies required for progression in the nursing program.
- ❖ **Physical Examination/Current Immunization Documentation/Current** – All Health Packet requirements including the physical exam, immunizations, CPR, etc. will be covered by Angela Graham at the Health Packet Orientation Session.
