3. Reports

3.1 President's Report

- I attended the N4CSGA conference from October 16th to the 19th. In bill GS-115, the local SGA president's seat on the board of Trustees is optional, and unlike Rowan-Cabarrus, some SGA presidents do not sit on their board of Trustees. The resolution affirms the importance of student voice in college governance, giving the SGA President a formal platform to advocate for student needs directly at the Board of Trustees level. N4C has come up with a resolution involving the verbiage change of the SGA president may sit on the board of trustees will sit on the board of trustees. They will also be reaching out to legislators to aid us in our cause.
- I attended the Board of Trustees meeting on October 22nd. FBLA state officers, Isabella Jimenez, June Goodman, and National officer Colin Williams, were recognized for being the first state and national officers from the FBLA Rowan-Cabarrus chapter.
- The Financial year 2025-2026 budget was approved for \$100,161,196 in total institutional funds.
- On Friday, October 16th, we held our annual golf classic tournament, where college donors contributed in exchange for playing golf for the day, resulting in the awarding of over 52 scholarships.
- The Academic & Student Engagement Committee met on October 20th and reviewed Credit for Prior Learning, Propel Partner Courses, and enrollment updates, highlighting ways to give students academic credit for prior experience, create seamless pathways between continuing education and curriculum, expand

workforce-aligned programs, and support over 1,000 Basic Skills students with federal and state funding.

At the N4CSGA Fall Conference, we learned that Rowan-Cabarrus CC will be moving to a new division within the NCCCS, which is expected to bring stronger support, new opportunities for student programs, and more statewide collaboration.
